Sally and Forrest Hogleund are truly pillars of the Dallas and HPISD community. Individually and through The Hogleund Foundation they have been strong supporters of numerous non-profits in Dallas and across the State of Texas. Forrest chaired the capital campaign that raised over \$185 million to build the Perot Museum of Nature and Science in downtown Dallas and was instrumental in getting Reasoning Mind, a web based math curriculum, in Dallas schools. He is the recipient of many prestigious awards including the 2013 Linz Award in honor of his commitment of service to this community.

Sally has given generously of her time and talent to significant groups such as AWARE, The Family Place and United Way of Metropolitan Dallas. She was the co-founder of the popular Partners Card that raises funds for abused women and their children. She continues to dedicate time to many other organizations such as the Senior Source, Visiting Nurses Association, Chiapas International and Dallas Summer Musicals.

The Hogleunds and The Hogleund Foundation have been long-time supporters of the Highland Park School District, both with their time and through donations. They are consistent annual donors to Mad for Plaid supporting our Highland Park teachers and provided the matching grant that allowed the Highland Park Education Foundation to build a much needed addition to their small office next to Highlander Stadium. They have also funded the Tartan Endowment Fund and the HPHS Fine Arts program.
